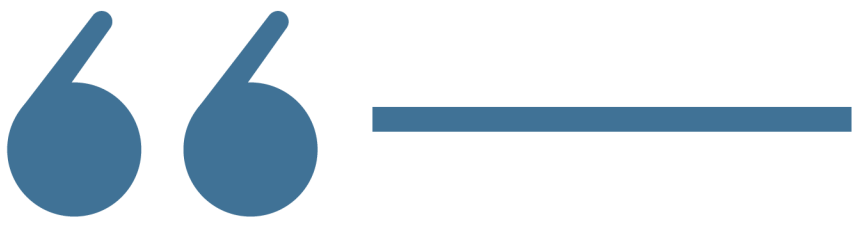


Peter Idoko

various events aimed at supporting and building community. His

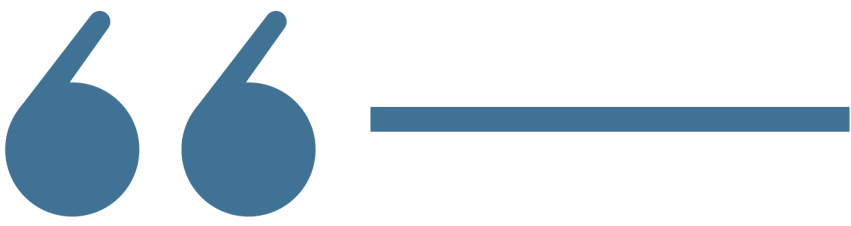
involvement provided him the opportunity to represent the
